They are still here, of course; some smiling upon us from their apparently empty places rejoicing in each successive generation at prayer and many seated today in our congregation. How blessed we are by their loving presence. As November begins, we set aside a date, All Saints Day; in truth, every day is a day to celebrate the saints among us. May God bless you, always.

In October the Iraqi children received the pencil and paper supplies which were gifts of the congregation of Christ Episcopal Church.

Oct. We plan to deliver some more supplies to a school that is in a poor neighborhood. The students and teachers were overwhelmed with the generosity that they received. I am hoping to have an article placed in the *Valdosta Daily Times* about your contribution. The Public Affairs Office wrote an article on the school's opening, and I was

interviewed and mentioned the project. I have pictures that I am attaching to this e-mail. You can send what you currently have on hand. I am trying to find a point of contact to continue with the project. I will be leaving my current location in late November. After that time I will be unable to receive or distribute any

more school supplies. I will keep you updated on the project's future.

The scarves would be a great idea if the stitchers can have them here before I leave the area. Let Deacon Patricia Marks know that if this is not possible, tell everyone thanks for their hard work and donations.

I will send more pictures and updates every chance I get. Take care and I love ya'll.

Canterbury Club and Episcopal College Ministries

¬he Canterbury Club is a ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia through its Valdosta member parishes Christ Church, Christ the King, and St. Barnabas. The mission of the Canterbury Club is to offer a space for students, faculty, and staff of VSU, Georgia Military College, and Val Tech to rest, study, worship, serve, and grow in faith. Some of us are Episcopalians, but others come from a variety of denominational and faith backgrounds. Some of us are well established in our beliefs, and others are questioning their faith. All of us are part of a loving and supportive community of disciples who are helping each other follow the way of Jesus, who calls to a life of radical hospitality by loving God, loving everyone else, and loving ourselves.

Canterbury Club has been hosted at Christ Church for over three decades. The Rev. J. Robert (Bob) Carter came to Christ Church in 1977, and at the encouragement of then rector the Rev. Henry I. Louttit, Jr., began Canterbury Club with four to five participants. He invited college students for a Tuesday night supper and Bible study which met in the front living room of his home, later called Canterbury House (since razed). Fr. Carter left Christ Church in 1982 to be founding pastor at St. Barnabas. Canterbury Club



continued but lacked a full time person dedicated to the organization. The Rev. Peter L. Ingeman came to Christ Church in 1987 as Assistant Rector and Chaplain for Canterbury Club. Working with Sister Ellen at St. John's Catholic Church, they jointly hosted Canterbury Club at Canterbury House and established an event schedule. At the time, the VSC dining hall was not open on Sunday evenings, so Sundays provided a perfect opportunity for a dinner and program for students; Bible study and movie night were held on other evenings during the week. Canterbury Club members have participated in Vocare, a renewal weekend designed for young adults, and two diocesan college weekends at Camp Honey Creek. From 2002 to 2004, Rev. Mary R. Hemmer served as Chaplain for Canterbury Club. In the future, Christ Church plans to rehire a full-time priest to coordinate Canterbury Club/Episcopal College

Ministries. VSU faculty member
Patricia Bezona's faithful
service as sponsor has allowed
Canterbury Club to maintain its
status as a recognized VSU
student organization.

Canterbury Club opened this academic year on August 24 with a cookout hosted by VSU
