In December 2005 James Lawrence Elliott began the process that led him to his ordination as a priest in Savannah on August 21, 2010, at 11 a.m. in St. Peter's Episcopal Church. During those five years Jim had many meetings with Fr. Peter Ingeman, Bishop Henry Louttit, Bishop Scott Benhase, the Discernment Committee, the Diocesan examining chaplains, the Commission on Ministry and the Standing Committee. He spent three summers at the University of the South at Suwanee, Tennessee studying theology, philosophy, church history, liturgy, homiletics and more with many tests and exams along the way.

"Throughout the process my wife, Susan, and our three sons - Gus, 20; Alex, 18; and Carter, 14 - have been extremely supportive and given me the freedom to pursue this path," said Jim.

He has continued to practice law in partnership with his brother Walter during this process and serves as chancellor to the Diocese of Georgia

## The Church Bookshelf

The Practice of the Presence of God by Brother Lawrence. 1692 Christian Classics Ethereal Library

For book lovers, an "Ethereal Library" sounds like the new Eden. Here indeed, free for the reading, are Christian Classics of all kinds, including Brother Lawrence's wonderful reminder that God is with us in all walks. A former soldier and footman who joined the discalced (barefoot) Carmelites to atone for his sins, Brother Lawrence, consigned to the kitchen and later to mending sandals, found the joy of God's presence in his most commonplace acts. As he says, "We can do little things for God; I turn the cake that is frying on the pan for love of him." His profound faith—and joy in it—was anchored in a "habitual, silent, and secret conversation

of the soul with God." Not that it was easy, given the common lot of daily cares, pain, and illness. And perhaps, in this noisy age of ours, it seems impossibly idealistic—after all, Brother Lawrence lived in a monastery where he was expected to be prayerful. But as he observes, the will to develop a "holy habit" of thinking of God allows us to be with Him; and being with Him means praying; and in praying we have withdrawn to that "oratory of the heart" where we offer every daily trifle, from washing dishes to making board-room decisions, to Him out of love. That indeed is the practice of the presence of God.

## **Ordinations**

There is only one way for a lay person to be ordained as a deacon or a priest within the Diocese of Georgia and the Episcopal Church: to be ordained as such by our diocesan bishop, the Rt. Reverend Scott Anson Benhase, or another bishop specifically designated for this purpose by Bishop Benhase, following a rigorous process detailed in both the Canons of the Episcopal Church and the Canons of the Diocese of Georgia. There is no other way. As previous articles in this series have described, a large portion of

the work of the organizational structure within the Diocese of Georgia involves several committees who assist candidates for ordination in the years of their discernment and education processes, culminating in the formal approval of candidates for ordination by the Standing Committee, the Bishop's Council of Advice. After the Standing Committee's approval is received, only then may Bishop

Benhase proceed to ordain the candidate in a public worship service that includes this dramatic action as specified in

the Book of Common Prayer, page 533:

Here the Bishop lays hands upon the head of the ordinand....

The Book of Common Prayer, page 524, also contains the following instruction for an ordination that insures that everyone present can participate in the service:

> From the beginning of the service until the Offertory, the bishop presides from a chair placed close to the people, and facing them, so that all may see and bear what is done.

So although only a bishop of a diocese can ordain a person, the people of the individual churches may participate in that person's ordination, much as we do in all other aspects of the common life and work of the Diocese of Georgia.

There is only one way for a lay person to be ordained as a deacon or a priest . . . by our diocesan bishop.



"Preaching is an important part of my ministry, but just one piece of the puzzle. I know that God is in charge," Jim said.

"This stepping stone will open doors for me to do ministry I haven't done before like the administration of sacraments and the liturgy. I am humbled, awed, and very excited about the gift God has given me."






## **Christ Church Looks Back**

As reported in the August Vineyard, Vicar Clifton H. White informed Vestry on February 1, 1953, that he had submitted his resignation to Bishop Middleton S. Barnwell on January 1. He intended to leave Christ Church on March 21, 1953. Immediately afterward, Senior Warden Jamie Carroll read aloud a letter from the Bishop that focused on replacing Fr. White. Barnwell suggested that Vestry be prepared to pay the new Vicar, whoever he was, a monthly salary of \$400. Thereupon, Vestry passed a motion for Mr. Carroll to warn the Bishop in writing that Christ Church's 1953 budget was already in effect and could not support a salary of more than \$200 a month "at the most" for the remainder of the year. The parish might be able to increase the amount to \$400 monthly in 1954, depending "very heavily on the ability of the replacement sent to this Church."

Bishop Barnwell attended the next regular Vestry meeting on Sunday, March 1, 1953, as did Fr. White. Barnwell opened the session and led a discussion "covering possible replacement for Mr. White." Mr. Carroll reported that vestrymen had seen all the candidates the Bishop had suggested, and vestrymen then made comments about each. One of the possibilities, the Rev. Vernon Quigley of Tallahassee, had written to Mr. Carroll removing himself from consideration, and the others obviously aroused little more than

feeble interest among vestrymen. Therefore, the group asked for specific instructions from the Bishop about how to proceed. Barnwell responded by urging vestrymen "not to be in great haste." He said "that he had us very much in mind, and would see that we were taken care of." The Bishop put forward a few names as potential temporary replacements to be used after Fr. White's departure on Saturday, March 21. He assured vestrymen that he would "see that we have a temporary man at any rate" and urged the members "not to worry." At that point, Barnwell left the meeting.

After the Bishop's withdrawal, the group dealt with some practical matters related to the Vicar's impending exit. Fr. White recommended a Vestry committee to "oversee the care of the rectory and grounds . . . pending the arrival of [the] new vicar." Robert G. Macks and Roy Newham agreed to accept that responsibility. Vestry also stipulated that the Parish Register was "to be in custody of [the] Senior Warden [Mr. Carroll] who will make any necessary . . . entries." The Vestry Clerk, Mr. Macks, in addition, received directions to write two candidates who had previously visited Christ Church to thank them for coming and to enclose in each letter a check for \$15.00 to cover expenses.

Having advised Christ Church's Vestry on Sunday, March 1, 1953, "not to be in great haste" to hire a new Vicar, Bishop Barnwell hastily located a promising contender in the

person of the Rev. Michael J. Kippenbrock of St. Thaddeus Episcopal Church in Aiken, South Carolina. He informed Vestry of his discovery by letter on Wednesday, March 4, 1953, and a committee of vestrymen visited St. Thaddeus Church on Sunday March 7, 1953. Vestry subsequently convened in a called meeting on Thursday, March 12, 1953, and heard the visiting committee's report, the essence of which was that the committee "was much impressed by Mr. Kippenbrock." On the basis of a Dawson-Tucker motion, which passed unanimously, Vestry agreed that Mr. Carroll should telephone Bishop Barnwell immediately with the request that he "proceed to call Mr. Kippenbrock, in line with his letter to us of March fourth." Mr. Carroll quickly made contact with Barnwell by telephone and afterward returned to the session to report that the Bishop had promised to "contact Mr. Kippenbrock tomorrow." He stated that Barnwell had pledged as well to "assume the extra for the new vicar's salary for the balance of this calendar year, but after that 'we are on our own." This meant that the Diocese would be responsible for \$200 of the \$400 monthly salary to be paid Fr. Kippenbrock from the date he began work, which turned out to be May 1, 1953, through December 31. Beginning January 1, 1954, Christ Church would have to pay the full amount without any help from Savannah.

More to come in the October *Vineyard* and in the following months, so stay tuned.

#### Phyllis Hiers and Mimi Allen Teach St. Francis Nature Camp at Honey Creek



















For the last 19 years Phyllis Hiers and Mimi Allen, both long-time members of Christ Church as well as educators in the Valdosta City School system, have taught the children of our diocese about nature at Honey Creek at a one-week camp in July. During the camp, the teens in grades 7 - 9 learned about the ecology of the marsh, identified birds native to the area, constructed marshes-in-a-tub which were attacked by oil spills and "Hurricane Mimi" with a fan, walked through the forest and swung on vines, played predator-prey games, discussed alternative energy sources, went on night walks to see the critters and talked about the stars.
