Spiritual Growth

This class meets on Sunday mornings for approximately 45 minutes, usually in the rectory. The class will be taught in 6-week segments by different instructors who specialize in different aspects of spirituality. The class began with a segment entitled, "Time Management for Spiritual Growth," taught by Dr. Phyllis Holland, Professor of Management in the Valdosta State University College of Business Administration. There were 8 to 10 participants in the scripture-based class.

Lucy Tomberlin, who attended the class said, "The scripture established the need for spirituality in our lives, and Dr. Holland offered us some suggestions for ways to organize so that we had time for spiritual growth. A person needs to figure out what is important in life and set priorities," she concluded.

Next in the series was Fr. Ingeman's class on the nature of spirituality and Benedictine monasticism. Deacon Stella Clark talked about her pilgrimage to Santiago de Campostella. In early November she showed a video made by another pilgrim about the walk in Spain. In December Deacon Patricia Marks will

Vestry Report from October 18, 2010

- Approved \$5,000 for further painting of the church.
- Received a report that the Facilities Committee met with architects. Requested changes have been made to the drawings of the new Parish Hall and the new Education building, and the elevation problem had been dealt with. In addition, the Capital Funds campaign was very close to \$1.5 million in pledges.
- Approved Walter Hobgood for ordination to the transitional diaconate.
- Received report 2011 Stewardship Campaign letters would soon go out to the Parish to launch a onemonth campaign. Also passed around copies of the proposed diocesan budget for 2011, which included \$10,000 for the V.S.U. chaplain position.
- Reported a proposed change in the Diocesan Canons, to be acted on the 2011 Convention in Valdosta, that would drop the "asking" for churches in the Diocese and insert an "assessment" at 10 percent for each church.
- Appointed the outgoing Vestry members as a Nominating Committee, with Phyllis Holland as Chair, to make certain that persons suggested for election to the Vestry actually be willing to serve before being placed on the ballot.
- Received report on Christian Education. The Rev. Tar

- Drazdowski is Bishop Benhase's representative on the Dominican Development Group and recently attended one of its meetings.
- Reported that Phyllis Holland and the Stitchers of Love will take part in a project to provide red and white knitted scarves for each participant in the Special Olympics.
- Received report from the Chancellor of the Diocese of Georgia that the Diocese presently is waiting for the Georgia Supreme Court to determine whether to hear the property litigation involving Christ Church Savannah.
- Noted that the Sunday School program is running well and announced upcoming events.
- Reminded the Vestry that Dr. John C. Roberts, a Professor Emeritus from McMasters University in Toronto, will speak twice at Christ Church on October 20-21. On the 20th his topic is "How Do We Speak of God?" and on the 21st his subject is "Secularism."
- Announced upcoming adult events: Oktoberfest, Cursillo, Adult Sunday School classes, and three Bible Study classes.



Christmas Card Project

Dr. Hanae Kanno is an Assistant Professor in the Division of Social Work at Valdosta State University. She spent nine years at the University of Pittsburg School of Social Work, graduating with a Ph.D. and masters degrees. When she was interviewing for a job in July 2010, she met Christ Church member Diane Halim, an assistant professor of Social Work who was part of the interview team. After Diane brought Hanae to visit our church, Hanae knew she would choose Valdosta because, "God was telling me this could be my home," she said.

Hanae grew up in Tokyo, Japan, in a family with strong Episcopalian ties. Her great aunt, Ms. Utako Hayashi, translated for Channing Moore Williams, the Episcopal missionary to China and Japan from 1850 to 1900. Her great aunt and her great grandmother worked with The Rev. Williams to found the church Hanae attended her entire life, St. Margaret's. The women and Williams also founded a school and hospital. Hanae attended the school for 14 years, from pre-kindergarten through high school. The website of her Japanese Episcopal home church, St. Margaret's, is

In the 1980's Prof. Kanno's relative, Bishop Yamada, an Episcopal Bishop, made friends with the bishop of Maryland. They formed an exchange program and a sister church relationship. Hanae visited Maryland in the late 1990's staying in Churchville, Maryland, with three families for 10 days. Following her time as a guest, she was motivated to come back to America to graduate school.

Continuing her family's efforts to connect with Episcopalians wherever they are, Prof. Kanno would like to take Christmas cards signed by Christ Church members to the members of St. Margaret's church in Tokyo when she returns to Japan during the Christmas holidays beginning December 14.

She breaks into a smile when she talks about her home church. "It has about 200 members and a wonderful choir," she says. "There are three

"I am making a bridge between Japan and Georgia," she says.

Living in Two Kingdoms

By David Adam. Morehouse, 2007.

David Adam, formerly the Vicar of the Holy Island of Lindisfarne, calls us to see our lives as the transparent places they are--the intersection of the material and spiritual, the holy and the down to earth. His call to contemplation comes through a set of eight perceptive meditations centered on the Prodigal Son story. Each chapter closes with a call to Pause, to be aware of God's Presence, to Picture a real-life application of the story, to Ponder the landscape of God's love, and to Promise to return home as the Prodigal did by maintaining an awareness of God's presence — which is, after all, an experiential form of prayer. It is that constant prayer, an ongoing conversation with God, that reveals the way the Spirit and the Flesh are interwoven and gives us the essence of Celtic spirituality.

class sometimes discusses the readings of the current Sunday particularly when there is a confusing or difficult lesson. One of the participants, Pepi Nelson said, "Having studied the Bible in EFM class, I particularly enjoy hearing the different perspectives and backgrounds the members of our parish bring to the class. We have a wide range of ages and points of view that are fascinating."

Marriage and Family

Sandy and Elise Sandbach are teaching this class during the Sunday School hour beginning at 10:30 a.m. and lasting about 45 minutes. The class has a textbook entitled, "The Art of Being Together," written by The Rev. Dr. Francis Wade. The book is loosely based on the Marriage Encounter experience. There are several couples in the class – some recently married, some married for 15 years, and the teachers, married for 29 years. They talk about the balance in the marriage relationship and avoiding emotional adultery where work, children, obsessive-compulsive behavior, volunteerism, hobbies, and other people or things can become divisive factors which need to be kept in balance. One member of the class, Tina Nunn said, "It is wonderful to have the Sandbachs who are both professionals and have a very loving relationship as teachers."

Sandy Sandbach said, "This class is very rich in the diversity of experience with some people just married and others with 15 to 20 years experience. We would welcome others to join at any time."

Tuesday Night Bible Class

Taught by Dr. Willa Valencia, the Tuesday night Bible class meets at 7 p.m. at the home of Eloise Smith at 607 Mack Drive. The group of 17 - 20 is studying I Peter and Exodus.

Wednesday Night Bible Class

Tammy Borders teaches the Wednesday Night Bible class in the front room of the parish hall. The class begins at 6:45 p.m. Several parishioners attend the Wednesday night Eucharist and take the supper prepared by the Parten family into the class. 

Christ Church Looks Back

As reported in the November Vineyard, the Vestry of Christ Church again approached the American Church Building Fund Commission in early June 1953, this time about borrowing \$7,000.00 to finance construction of Sunday School rooms at the rear of the Parish Hall. Richard P. Kent, Jr., Secretary of the A.C.B.F.C., quickly answered the letter that Vestry Clerk Robert G. Macks had written in behalf of Christ Church. Kent's response is not in the Parish files, but subsequent developments make clear that what he said was favorable.

The Minutes of a called Vestry meeting on Tuesday, June 16, 1953, state specifically that the reason for the gathering was "to discuss a letter received from the American Church Building Fund in reference to a loan of \$7,000.00." Vestrymen quickly approved a motion "to proceed with the plans for the Sunday School addition at a maximum cost, including furnishings, not to exceed \$10,000.00." Senior Warden Jamie Carroll appointed a four-man Building Committee, with the Vicar, Fr. Kippenbrock, as an ex officio member. The Building Committee was "to report back in detail at the next meeting of the Vestry, with plans for the addition and guaranteed bids covering construction." Mr. Carroll also said that he would contact Bishop Middleton S. Barnwell immediately to seek his approval of the project. Attached to the Minutes of this meeting is a hand-written note, dated The Vineyard, p. 10, December 2010

June 17, 1953, and directed to Robert G. Macks. Its message was that Mr. Carroll had talked with the Bishop by telephone and that Barnwell "endorses any move . . . [we] want to make on church property."

Vestry "instructed" Mr. Macks to thank the A.C.B.F.C. for being willing so soon to consider a new loan request from Christ Church. Macks was to report that, "on the strength of . . . [the] letter [from Richard P. Kent, Jr.], we will proceed at once with our plans for the Sunday School addition." In the short term, "financing . . . [would] be taken care of locally . . . to give the Foundation a bit more time." Once the building job reached its conclusion "we will furnish satisfactory documents to the Foundation, looking forward to . . . completion of the loan under conditions prescribed."

At the Vestry's regular monthly session on Sunday, July 5, 1953, work on the Sunday School project resumed. The Building Committee reported having received permission to extend the Parish Hall eastward by forty-seven feet. A local architect, Joe Bright, had been engaged to develop detailed plans and had submitted drawings of an annex to the Parish Hall of about 1,504 square feet, containing six classrooms and a heater room, with two of the classrooms separated by folding doors. The plans called for blackboards in all the rooms.

The Building Committee to date had received two construction bids. The first bidder, not identified by the Minutes, stated that he would complete the project at a cost of \$8,864.00 for the building, excluding a heating system. His bid document stated that he would match the exterior of the annex to the existing buildings. The second bid, from E.W. "Bill" Tullis, was for \$7,500.00 with the construction "to be completed within sixty days, payment due at completion date or [to be] carried at five percent [interest] until" the proposed loan was received from the A.C.B.F.C. The Tullis bid featured such items as "cabinets under windows and gutters." Tullis also estimated that duct work for a heating system could be installed for \$200.00 or an entire heating system, including heater, ducts, oil tank, and electric control unit, could be put in for \$500.00.

Then, on a Louis Kafoure-Glenn Robinson motion, Vestry authorized the Building Committee "to sign a contract with a builder to construct proposed addition, complete with heating system for \$8,000...." The Committee also was to work out the details of installation of an attic fan in the annex and to provide for the annex to be treated against termites. The original buildings, constructed in 1948-1949, had not been provided with termite protection, and the Church had suffered a termite invasion and some damages in 1950. [See Vineyard, August 2009, p.10 for details of the termite episode.]

A final item of business at the July 5th meeting was the continuing issue of a new vicarage for Christ Church. The only action taken was to defer the question until the next meeting.
